## Working with the graph



I made the middle part of the graph a bit vague. This is the part we crocheted last week.

In round 11 there are only 10 increase and there is a decrease. This is to get the right number of stitches for the side pattern. The decrease is marked with green.
(See page 5 for instructions for the decrease)
Round 11 ends early.
In the corners of round 11, you see a blank stitch. Just ignore this. Do as if the green stitches are next to each other.
(Because we are only increasing 10 times in this round, there are too many stitches in the graph. That is why one stitch is white in each corner.)

The finished oval bottom will look like this.
(After Ann and Angelique finished the bottom, I decided to make a little change at the end of the last round. In the pictures below you see that the round has ended a little different than in the instructions above. Just ignore the last stitches in the pictures below.)


The size of the finished oval bottom will be about, 30 to $32 \mathrm{~cm} / 11.8$ to 12,5 inch by $10 \mathrm{~cm} / 4$ inch.
Sizes can be different for each person. Everybody crochets differently.
