Part 2 of the round bottom

Written instructions

At the end of round 13, we make an extra increase. This is to make the jog less noticeable. The start of the round will stay in the same place. You will have one stitch extra.

The bottom can look a bit pointy from here on. This is because the increases are almost in the same place for every round now.

20. * 2D, 6C, 1B, inc B, 1B, 6C, 3D, 6E, 1A, inc A, 1A, 6E, 1D * [4x] [5x], 2D, 6C, 1B, inc B, 1B, 6C, 3D, 6E, 1A, inc A, 1A, 6E, 2D (191) (229)

21. * 3D, 6C, inc B, 1B, 6C, 5D, 6E, inc A, 1A, 6E, 2D * [4x] [5x], 3D, 6C, inc B, 1B, 6C, 5D, 6E, inc A, 1A, 6E, 3D (201) (241)

22. * 4D, 6C, inc B, 6C, 7D, 6E, inc A, 6E, 3D * [4x] [5x], 4D, 6C, inc B, 6C, 7D, 6E, inc A, 6E, 4D (211) (253)

In round 23 the increases are made in color D. The graph looks a little strange because of that, but when you crochet it like this, it will look good. (See picture below)

The transition from the bottom to the side pattern will look better when the increases are done in color D.

Round 23 ends early, so the transition from the bottom to the side will look better.

23. * inc D, 4D, 12C, 4D, inc D, 4D, 12E, 4D * [4x] [5x], inc D, 4D, 12C, 4D, inc D, 4D, 7E (221) (265)



You now have 221 stitches when you increased 10 times and 265 stitches when you increased 12 times.

By ending round 23 early, the start of the round has been changed. At this point we will start with the side pattern. (next week, of course)

Move the marker to the new start of the round.

Working with the graph

I made the middle part of the graph a bit vague. This is the part we crocheted last week.

At the end of round 13, we make an extra increase. This is to make the jog less noticeable. The start of the round will stay in the same place. You will have one stitch extra.

From this point on the last stitch of the round is cut in half with a small black line. These two halves on the graph count as two normal stitches.

In round 23 the increases are made in color D. The graph looks a little strange because of that, but when you crochet it like this, it will look good. (See picture above)

The transition from the bottom to the side pattern will look better when the increases are done in color D.


Round 23 ends early, so the transition from the bottom to the side will look better.




12 increases



The diameter is about, 21 to 22 cm / 8.3 to 8.7 inch
